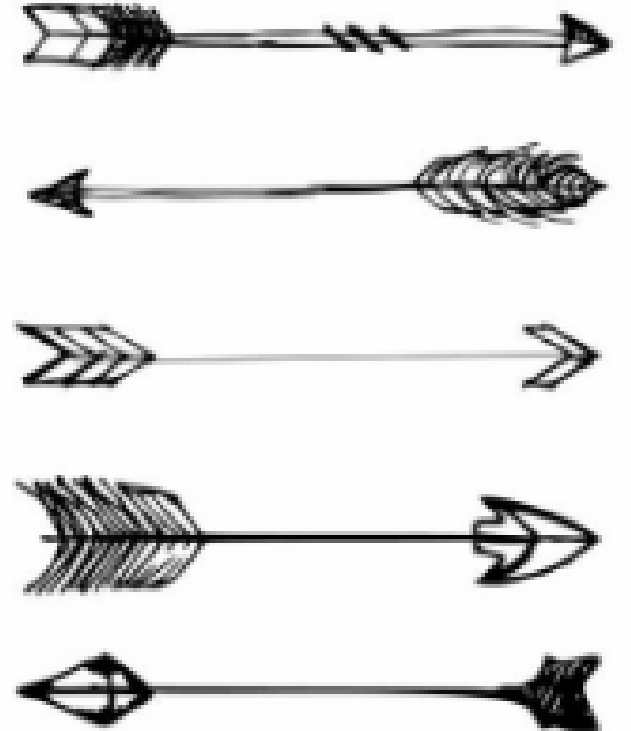


Welcome

Our aims in Year 2:

3 Why did JJ agree to paint the shed wall?

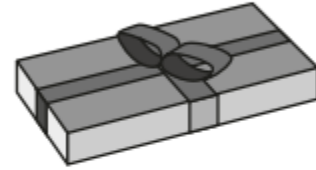
